# Committee Reports

## Leadership

### **Moderating Team:**

As I begin another report, I am led to reflect on the words in Psalm 122:1, “I was glad when they said to me, ‘Let us go into the house of the Lord’. Here David is expressing his joy that the Tabernacle of the Lord has found a final resting place in Jerusalem, and that he can go there to worship.”(See 2 Sam. 5 and 6)

We also have again been given the privilege and freedom to worship, together as a congregation, in God’s house. Our recent experience should remind us that this freedom should never be taken for granted.

With our services resuming, we are seeing a gradual attendance growth in the English Service. Many new faces are joining us regularly. Our German service, however, is declining in physical attendance on a Sunday morning but the impact that the service provides is far reaching. Due to the possibility of livestream, this service is watched by our members in the Care Homes as well as those who are still living on their own but unable to attend in person. Many others from around our area, who are not connected to King Road, but are blessed through the German language service, as well as from other parts of the world are watching regularly.

As I mentioned in my last report, our aim is to give prayerful attention to the vision of King Road MB. One of the things that we were led to do was to reach the South Asian community with the Gospel in our city and beyond. With that in mind, we began to explore the possibility of hiring someone to fill the role of an Outreach Pastor. After much prayer and discussion, a Search Team was formed, and a suitable candidate was found in Imran Daniel. He was brought to the church for a vote and passed with an overwhelming majority. His service at King Road MB began April 18, 2022.

In our Leadership Board meetings, Heins Schartner, on behalf of the Pastoral Team, has taken us through a video series called “Like Jesus”. This is a program that walks believers through the various stages of their spiritual journey and encourages all of us to go from a new believer to becoming disciple makers.

The Pastoral team and staff have already worked through this. They have now shared it with the Leadership Board and with some more work to tailor it to suit King Road MB, we are working toward sharing this and including the rest of the congregation in this journey, most likely through the small group ministry.

The vision is to facilitate King Road MB attendees to be instructed in the Word, to grow in our spiritual lives, and to support one another in sharing this with those around us. Our focus remains to Love God, Love People and Make Disciples.

The Leadership Board is also overseeing the reworking of our bylaws and operating guidelines. Many things have changed since the last time we did this, so we need to update.

As a Leadership Board, we take our role seriously and strive to recommend individuals to serve on this board who have the best interest of the church in mind. Our aim, although not always achieved, is to work with individuals well before positions open to give potential candidates an insight into the workings of the church. To do this, we have had some men join us in an observatory capacity to get a better understanding of what is involved, should they be asked to serve.

I would like to thank our Pastoral Team and staff for the tireless work that they continue to provide, as well as all our volunteers for the many hours of service that each one of you puts in. You may sometimes think that much of your effort goes unnoticed, but were it not for your selfless dedication, our church would not function. Also, a big thank you for all your faithful giving. Throughout the year, the Lord has been faithful to provide all our needs through your generous donations.

### **Children's Ministry Internship:**

#### **Marissa Gross:**

As a summer intern in the Children's Ministry department at King Road Church, I was tasked with aiding in planning Vacation Bible School, cleaning and rearranging resource rooms, occasionally planning lessons to teach in Sunday School, and organizing special events at the church throughout the summer.

VBS is the leading project of the summer and requires significant time for planning and preparation. Its purpose is to reach the children in our community, presenting the Gospel in a fun and creative way while sharing the love of Christ with them. This summer, VBS ran from July 26th to 30th from 9:30-11:30 am every day. Its theme was "Treasured," which taught the kids that they are priceless in God's eyes. Each day, we focused on a different aspect of God: He knows us, He hears us, He comforts us, He chooses us, and He forgives us.

Some of my personal highlights from this summer's VBS included the ability to offer the kids a "normal" VBS experience, since we no longer needed to limit the number of registrations or enforce physical distancing, as we did last summer due to the COVID-19 pandemic. It brought smiles to everyone's faces, both the children and volunteers, to be able to engage openly and comfortably with one another. Another

highlight for me was the large number of volunteers that stepped up to help and the many children that signed up; it was very encouraging to see how many kids we were able to reach through the program this summer. Elfriede, Deanna, and I also experimented with some new creative ways to run the program, many of which made it run quite smoothly. For example, we decided to separate the preschool-aged children while the older kids rotated between stations, but still met with everyone during the beginning and end of VBS each day. This was very helpful because the younger kids were able to enjoy a less chaotic setting with easier crafts and simpler lessons, better catered to their age group.

- We are thankful for the covid guidelines that allowed us to meet as a group.
- Overall, our youth nights (Thursday & Friday) are well attended and the groups are very consistent. We have seen both groups grow and have many new kids attending. However, we did have to say goodbye to a handful of youth this year.

The COVID-19 pandemic has continued to encourage us to get creative on how we provided youth ministry but we are so incredibly thankful for the lifting of restrictions that allowed us to host some of our regular and well-loved events.

**Bus ministry:** in 2021 we once again insured our church bus and it has been good to take our youth out to places for activities and our youth retreat. Although we were not able to use it as much this past year, the bus continues to serve us well and we are very thankful for all the volunteer drivers that bless us with their services and time; you are very much appreciated! ### **Was there a particular struggle this year?**

Again this has been a challenging year due to Covid19 Pandemic. We could not provide a Seniors' Banquet or have Communion in Care Homes. Being CREATIVE was a challenge but thank God He provided as He always does!

### **What needs to be addressed moving forward?**

- A part- time paid Senior Care Pastor to provide additional care and support to our seniors.
- Hope & Goal: for more volunteers to be caregivers to replace the caregivers that will not be renewing their terms. To be able to provide more visits and care as well. We know many are already doing it in a less formal way & we appreciate that as well. This was a real challenge this year as many senior caregivers were not able to visit seniors in the homes due to the vaccination requirements.
- To be able to provide Communion at Tabor Village as well as Menno in April or May.

**Refresh Mobile Shower Ministry:**

People often wonder. "How can we improve the homeless situation in our community?" While there are many issues to address and very few answers, we feel that offering a free shower and clean underwear and socks to our homeless population is a small step to restoring dignity.

It has been an exciting year for this Ministry. We have become a non-profit organization and are working toward getting our charitable status. We remain a close partner of and are supported financially by King Road Church. One of our goals for the coming year is to expand our donor base as we rely fully on the generosity of donors to cover our many expenses.

Some highlights this year are:

- (1) We have expanded our ministry. We now offer showers at two locations, MCC on Thursday evenings in conjunction with a free meal & clothing, and at Archway Community Services Drop In Center on Monday and Wednesday afternoons.
- (2) We also provided free Showers during the Extreme Heat Alert at several locations in Abbotsford. We also attended a Celebration of Life Service for one of the MCC Volunteers who passed away during the Extreme Heat Alert.
- (3) On May 1, 2022 we will celebrated our 3<sup>rd</sup> Anniversary as Refresh Mobile Showers.
- (4) This spring we will be celebrating the 2000<sup>th</sup> Shower.
- (5) We have been blessed by being able to pray for some of our guests as well as being able to hand out Christian literature.

We have many regular guests who are very grateful for a shower. Building relationships and sharing the love of Jesus are the main goals of our faithful volunteers. We thank God for the opportunity to serve Him in this way. Thank you King Road Church, for your financial and prayer support.

**Columbia Bible College:**

**Member:** Christel Warkentin.

The health protocols brought on by the pandemic created challenges for Columbia Bible College. Everyone worked really hard to create an environment where students were still able to experience Campus Life.

There were 360 students enrolled at Columbia Bible College this school year. The ongoing pandemic had an impact on enrollment resulting in a 9% decline in tuition and other revenues. However this was more than offset by the money received from the Canada Employment Wage Subsidy. Without this, the financial picture would show a deficit, but now we are happy to report Columbia Bible College had a favourable financial result. Another highlight was the launching of the Junior Bearcats kids summer camps in August 2021 by the Columbia Athletic Department. Over 250 campers and 20 staff were involved in the Adventure and Multi-sport camps. To learn more about Jr. Bearcats Kids summer camps visit [columbia.edu/cbc-camps](http://columbia.edu/cbc-camps)

In September 2021 Columbia Bible College was again able to host the Columbia Open Golf Tournament and the postponed 2021 Graduation ceremony. Columbia is now partnering with Indiana Wesleyan University to help students use their courses toward the completion of online professional degrees, specifically a dual-degree option to complete a BA in Practical Theology and a BS in Business.

There were a number of renovations. Columbia Hall, which is the male residence, received new floors, completely new bathrooms and updated windows. The gym floor at the Athletic Centre also got refinished to include the updated Bearcats Logo.

Our mandate at King road Church speaks of making disciples and teaching them. This fits well with this mission statement of Columbia Bible College : Equip people for life of DISCIPLESHIP, MINISTRY and LEADERSHIP in service to the church and community.

I want to end this report with a message from the president, Bryan Born: “ Even as Columbia celebrates its 85th Anniversary, we invite you to join us in praying for God's provision, in envisioning God's direction for the future, and in supporting Columbia as we equip the next generation of Jesus followers.”

### **Mennonite Educational Institute:**

MEI is currently the largest independent school in British Columbia with nearly 1600 students and more than 220 staff. MEI is engaged with local community organizations, schools, and districts, and with provincial leadership groups including FISA (Federation of Independent School Associations). Our Head of Schools serves as an elected board member with FISA representing Christian Schools in ACSI (Association of Christian Schools International). These many connections have helped us face the challenges of the global pandemic this past year with courage, confidence, and in unity with others around us.

The MEI Board of Directors have great confidence in our leadership group and thank God for the way the school is being led. The primary focus is placed on honoring God, proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ, serving in a way that brings glory and honor to Him, putting children first, and supporting those who work most closely with our students. As a result of this focus, MEI has enjoyed a healthy student, staff, and parent culture amid the ups and downs of the past year due to the pandemic.

MEI is currently in the midst of the quiet phase of our Capital Campaign fundraising efforts to renovate the 40-year-old secondary building and to improve our campus. God-willing, this campaign will move to a public phase this fall, at which point we will share all details with the greater community. Some of the highlights from this past year include the amazing work of our students as demonstrated in the Christmas video production, a B.C. volleyball bronze medal finish for our Sr. Boys, and a B.C. basketball silver medal finish for our Sr. Girls. We have also seen amazing growth in our K - 12 Ecological Stewardship Program.

We praise God for His goodness and faithfulness and strive to prepare our students for a life of service to Jesus, our Saviour.

## Financial Package

During the fiscal year ended April 30, 2022, the Finance Committee (FC) consisted of six members: Jeff Loewen, Tina Ens, Josh Falk, Carolina Hein, Erwin Loewen (treasurer), and Linda Dueck (assistant treasurer). The committee has worked closely with Paul Siemens (Lead Pastor) and Michelle Degerness (bookkeeper). We have a very engaged team who spend hours reviewing, planning, and overseeing the financial situation of King Road Church.

At a high level, our role is to oversee the entire financial workings of King Road (this includes insurance). All funds received and spent are recorded. Over a million dollars annually needs to be accounted for. We are very grateful for the generous support of every person who contributes to the ministry of King Road Church.

In this past year, these were key parts of our work:

- The financial aspect of hiring an outreach pastor
- Supporting Refresh Mobile Shower Ministry in their process of becoming a non-profit society.
- Working with KPMG as they completed an external review of our financial statements. The process and end results were very positive.

We are amazed and grateful for your giving - above last year's offerings and above this year's budget. (More details can be found in the financial report later in this report booklet. Statements prepared and reviewed by KPMG are also available; please ask a Finance Committee member or the office staff for a copy.) We have done our best to trust God AND be prudent. It is never easy to cut back spending, but we are committed to living with our means. Again we see that God provides. Please pray for wisdom and vision as together, we make plans for the future.

We would like to highlight one more item in regards to how we are structuring our finances. We have worked hard to bring everything that involves finances into a unified approach. When you make a donation to King Road, it is a donation to the entire ministry of this congregation! We feel this is important for all of us to understand. Whether you put a cheque in the offering, or make a donation to the youth missions trip, or support our missions projects, your donation is to King Road Church. Understanding this helps us to serve together! When the King Road congregation approves a general budget, we commit to supporting the whole vision, with all its parts. The Finance Committee is working at communicating this principle consistently – to comply with legal and accounting rules, and to show good faith with all our donors.

Again, thank you for your prayers and your faithful, generous giving. Please pray for wisdom and discernment as we strive to be faithful stewards of what God has entrusted to us.

### **Report**

God is faithful! Thank you for your commitment to financially supporting King Road Church. This report has two sections: the year past, and the year that is beginning. Our goal is to provide a clear financial overview for the King Road membership. For anyone wanting more detail, please contact a FC member for a full set of statements.

### **The Year That Was (May 1, 2021 – April 30, 2022)**

April 30, 2019 concluded the first fiscal year in our new accounting/reporting system - in keeping with accepted accounting principles in Canada. So this is our fourth year tracking such things as capital assets and amortization. Nothing has changed in our commitment to being accurate in our recording, faithful in our giving, and transparent with the congregation.

Here are some key financial points from the year that was.

1. Our “Sunday” offerings totalled \$981,039 (compared to \$871,794 in 2020-2021). Our overall income for the year was \$1,132,417.

2. We ended the year with a surplus of \$93,618.

3. We were able to increase our “opening balance” (unrestricted funds) to \$363,971. Our goal is to maintain these reserves at a minimum level of \$150,000.

In addition to our general fund (budget), King Road has some restricted funds set aside. These include funds for building maintenance and specific ministries (DMI, Refugee, Benevolence, Student Aid, Trek). We also have prepaid funds (set aside 2 years ago) for the postponed youth missions trip, available for future use. It is important to note that these funds are designated for specific purposes and may not be used to fund our day-to-day operations. The FC wants to highlight for the congregation that there will be a need for capital projects in the future.

We feel that King Road is in a strong, stable financial situation. Our commitment is to monitor donations and ensure that we continue to live within our means.

## The Year That Is Beginning (May 1, 2022 – April 30, 2023) – Budget

We are recommending approval of a budget in the amount of \$1,227,856.

This budget is an increase compared with last year. We have tried to make a realistic estimate of our giving, and budget expenses accordingly. As always, FC will review the budget in October and suggest any necessary changes.

Here are some impacts of our budget:

- Offering amount is the key figure for consideration - FC suggests a minimal increase over last year's actuals
- Surplus budget of \$364
- Current surplus + previous year's surplus = strong reserves
- Wage increases plus the hiring of an additional pastor

FC intends to work with the management committee and leadership board on a capital budget for the next 3-5 years. We know that our building is aging and will require some maintenance above-and-beyond our regular budget. For now, this is simply a heads-up. King Road will need to raise additional funds in the future for needed capital upgrades.

Lastly, FC is recommending we have KPMG review our financial statements at the conclusion of the current fiscal year. This has been a valuable process for FC and we are very grateful for the service provided to us by KPMG.

Again, thank you for your financial support of King Road Church. May God continue to form us into grateful and generous stewards of his abundance.
