Our kids love routine. Each evening as part of our bedtime routine, one person gets to choose a story topic and then it is the job of Vanessa or myself to share a story on that theme. Often, these stories are linked to memories from the past. Significant, or insignificant moments that we remember. Reflection is an important part of life as it provides context to the story you are currently experiencing.

In my last update, I focused on the rhythm of *REMEMBER*, *FORGET* and *BELIEVE* found in Isaiah 43:18-19 and shared some questions I was challenged by for each rhythm. As we move through the month of April, we near the date of April 19, 2024. This date is significant because it marks the **50th anniversary of Athletes in Action Canada (AIA)** and gives us an opportunity to remember.

To understand the story of this milestone for AIA, we should start where it all started, the beginning of Campus Crusade for Christ (CCC). Bill and Vonette Bright, the founders of this ministry, responded to God's call in 1951, establishing the ministry on the campus of UCLA in California. AIA was then birthed in the USA from this campus ministry in 1966. Several years later, **Josh McDowell** was commissioned to the University of British Columbia to start a CCC ministry in Canada, now known as **Power to Change**.

It took another few years for AIA to form a Canadian ministry. This process began when professional Christian athletes from across the Canadian Football League (CFL) and various ministry leaders gathered together at **Teen Ranch** in Ontario to pray and seek God about a new national Christian sports ministry for Canada. Some early pioneers and directors of the ministry include Gord Barwell and Paul Henderson.

Within months, AIA began a coordinated effort to reach Canada and the world for Christ. From those faithful few many years ago, AIA Canada has grown from a 1974 grass roots Christian sports ministry into a national and world wide influencer for Christ - with over 100 staff ministering on university campuses, pro sports teams, club teams, sports camps across Canada while also providing opportunities to provide humanitarian aid, sport tours, camps and teaching to international partners.

As I enter my ninth year on staff. We are grateful for those who have gone before us to set a foundation to *Help people know Jesus and experience His power to change the world through sport*.

Thank you for continuing to support us and this ministry.

PS - My first Arrow Leadership intensive is scheduled to take place next week at Teen Ranch in Ontario. On April 19, 2024 I will be at the exact same location that AIA Canada was formed 50 years ago. I am looking forward to celebrating this unique opportunity.
