FINDING CONFIDENCE IN THIS...

"Yet I am confident that I will see the Lord's goodness while I am here in the land of the living. Wait patiently for the Lord. Be brave and courageous. Yes, wait patiently for the Lord." Psalm 27:13-14

I recently had a conversation with several athletes about confidence. Amongst the athletic world, confidence is a buzz word that is thrown around quite frequently. Players have it and don't have it, they perform better with it and poorer without it, they gain it from a variety of sources, but not always the same way. It is a curious thing that seems to walk alongside peak performance. As we discussed the topic, our conversation shifted to spiritual confidence, where it comes from and how it can accompany our faith.

For believers in Jesus Christ, confidence is a result of believing in his life, death and resurrection. It is the result of believing there is a loving and just God who created each of us in his image, who loves us regardless of what we have done, yet is just to deal with evil appropriately in his timing. I shared two areas I gain spiritual confidence in with these athletes:

- 1."For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith.....For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." (Eph. 2:8, 10)
- 2."And I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will continue his work until it is finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns." (Phil. 1:6)

Earlier this week as I was reading through Psalm 27, the word confident once again jumped off the page at me. David rooted his confidence in his understanding of a good God who would save him from his enemies and wouldn't abandon him. As you read this update, may you be rooted in the confidence of seeing "God's goodness in the land of the living."
